Stephen Steele Receives Highest ROTC Award

Stephen F. Steele, 17, of Farmington, a student at Howe Military School since September, 1960, was honored this week when he was presented the Army and Navy Legion of Valor Bronze Cross.

Cadet Major Steele, who is battalion staff commander, received the award from Major General John R. Pugh, commanding general, Sixth Army Corps, Battle Creek, Mich.

The presentation highlighted an honor guard and battalion review. It also marked the first time a Howe Military School cadet has received the award.

The Valor Bronze Cross is the highest award presented to other military schools in the high school level.

Major Steele, a senior honor student, was recommended for the honor while attending school as a Junior in May, 1963. His name and achievements were submitted for consideration along with candidates from 11 other military schools in the 1st State Fifth Army Corps.

PRESENTATION of the award completes another chapter in Cadet Steele's brilliant career at Howe Military School. The senior student is president of his class, a member of the National Honor Society and the school's debate team.

He holds the Association of U.S. Army Medal and two years ago won the Chicago Tribune ROTC silver medal for outstanding military, scholastic and leadership achievements. He also has been active in sports, participating in football, basketball and track.

Cadet Steele also served as class president during his Freshman, Sophomore and Junior years.

Now Visiting Ports In European Area

John V. Becker, season, USN, son of John A. Becker of 21122 Waldron St., Farmington, is visiting ports in the European area following participation in the largest amphibious combat training exercise in the Atlantic since World War II.

He is serving aboard the attack cargo ship USS Yancey. The operation, called "Steel Pike," featured U.S. and Spanish Marines landing from landing craft and helicopters of a combined U.S.-Spanish fleet of 45 vessels which included ships of the United States Military Sea Transport Service and chartered ships of the U.S. Merchant Fleet.

The mock assault on the beaches of Southern Spain was staged by Marines of the Second Marine Division, Second Marine Aircraft Wing and Force Troops, Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic, along with a battalion of Spanish Marines. "Steel Pike" showed the ability of the U.S. and Allied amphibious forces to rapidly transport large numbers of troops and all their equipment, get them ashore and maintain them for as long as necessary. It also tested the ability of both countries in conducting joint operations.

During the operation, the Yancey supplied equipment to the Marines' ground troops after their beach assault.

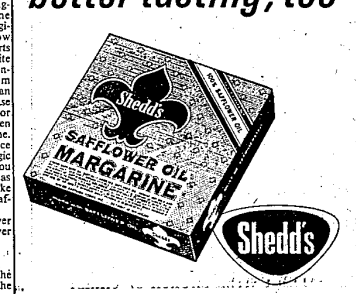
