You'll be interested to learn that the Farmington Meadows Association meeting of Nov. 8th, was attended by City Manager, John D. Dinan. Mr. Dinan's presence was to further develop and coordinate relations between the Association and Alta Berger, the industrial

area abutting the south boundary of our subdivision. The Association had protested the location of factory doors that open in the direction of our subdivision. The association received a letter from the city promising that the factory would remove, to another location, doors that lead to objectionable nuisances. If they do not comply the city will enforce removal. Additionally, the area south of the fence, along Meadow, will be cleaned up and all parties concerned are asked to keep all trash out of this section. An arrangement is being reached between the Association and the city concerning this same area. It has been suggested, as a concession on the part of the Meadows Association, that by black toping this area (and placing guard rails not closer than 10 feet from the south boundary fence) additional parking would be provided. To further enhance the industrial and homeowner area, the placing of evergreens and crushed rock, has also been suggested.

THE STOP-SIGN situation will be reviewed by a committee of the Board of Directors and the Chief of Police.

The association has received a letter from Mr. Smoker stating that 21 trees will be replaced and/or installed in our subdivision within the month of November.

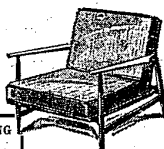
