Name 8 Falcons For All-League Honors in '64

Falcon gridders, Tom Mitchell, has been honored for his fine performance this past fall by being awarded positions on the All-Conference and All-County teams.

A senior and two year letter winner, Mitchell played offensive and defensive end on the Farmington squad and contributed greatly in the Falcons' drive to a very respectable 5-3-1 record.

On offense, he caught 14 passes, good for total of 123 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Mitchell was a standout on the "Demolition Crew," constantly pressuring the opposing quarterback on passes and holding down his end of the line on runs.

The last Farmington gridders to earn similar honors was Dale Pitecock, a member of the '62 team and... you guessed it... an end!

In the All-Conference voting, Terry Nielsen and Dick Johnston tied two Walled Lake players for positions on the first team, but the "Walled Lakers" were awarded the positions because of their team's higher finish in the league.

Nielsen and Mitchell combined all year long with the quarterback Mike Wilson to give the Falcons a passing punch. PHS backs Roy Leach and Bruce Charles and linemen Dick Lessway, Mike Perry, and Mike Freeman (voiced Most Valuable Linemen) were the others given All-League honors. Perry and quarterback Mike Wilson were elected captains for '65.

(Mullin was a standout member of the Albion defensive unit which held eight opponents to a total of 41 points and an average of 1.25 points per game.)

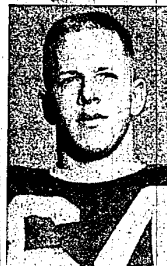
Name Jim Prisk To All-League Football Team

Duke's wrestling team, bent on improving its 2-7 record of last season, has been hard at work on the mats in the Indoor Stadium getting ready for the 1964-65 season.

The Blue Devil grapplers will wrestle nine opponents, including ACC rivals N. C. State, Virginia, North Carolina and perennial conference power Maryland. The opening meet is scheduled for Tuesday, December 8, against Davidson in Davidson, N.C.

Three lettermen—John Holder (No. 147) of Highland Park, Ill., ACTING CAPTAIN DICK LAM (No. 177) of FARMINGTON, Mich., and Bud Reynolds (No. 137) of Arlington, Va.—are expected to form the nucleus of this year's squad. However, a trio of sophomores will also be counted on heavily by coach Carmen Falcone.

Sophomores Carl Pfeiffer (No. 123), Pete Diltz (No. 139) and Malcolm McAlpin (No. 137) have been looking good in pre-season drills and may nail down starting positions.

According to Falcone, Holder is an "outstanding boy who should have a good season and be a definite threat in the ACC" at the end of the season. He was second at his weight class in the ACC Tournament a year ago.

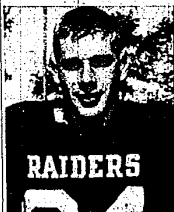

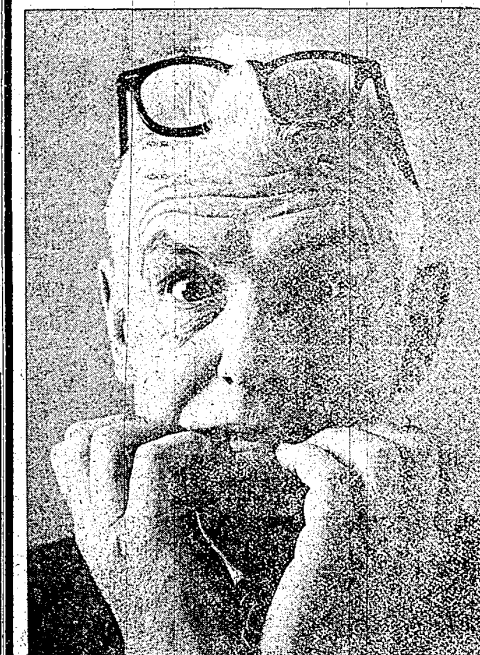
