

Gala Opening Slated For Junior Olympics

The seventh annual national AAU Junior Olympics will open a three-day program at the University of Michigan on Tuesday, Aug. 14.

There is no admission charge to the opening ceremony which will precede two days of competition in six sports for upwards to 700 boys and girls in the 10-16 range.

Sports include diving, gymnastics, judo, swimming, track and field, and trampoline.

Last year's event attracted 615 entries to Spokane, Wash.

Steve Danosi, Wayne State University's 1973 fencing captain and a two-time NCAA All-American in the sport, has been named to the United States' World University games team for the 1973

competition in Moscow, Aug. 15-25.

The selection of the Southfield junior-to-be provides a father-son combination for the team and gives Wayne State a three-man delegation.

Steve's father, 16-year-old WSU fencing coach Irvan, had already been named to coach the USA fencing team.

The younger Danosi will be a part of this country's four-man entry in sabre. Runnerup in the 1973 NCAAs individual sabre competition, Steve finished in a tie for first in the WUG trials at Tucson with 1973 NCAAs champ Pete Westbrook of Columbia.

Coach Danosi was the 1972 NCAAs coach of the year in the sport and took WSU to a perfect 15-0 season including the school's fourth Great
