Katz said, "Once you do know it, you can suggest playing with someone closer to his own age."

He added that among disturbed young people there are such differences in behavior patterns that "there is no way short of a complete psychiatric examination to know for sure if there is danger."

He did have a suggestion for a way society can help.

"It would be good," he stated, "if there were better mental health facilities, with psychiatric personnel in the schools where kids have more contacts."

"Unfortunately, the tendency now is to cut back on such personnel."

Dr. Claunch agreed there is practically no means of preventing all such incidents, but he suggested that "uncomfortable" feelings on the part of an adult with reference to a child should not be discounted.

"Whenever adults want to know what's going on with children, they sometimes overlook two important sources of information that are right at hand," he said.

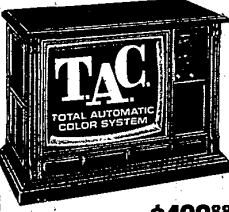
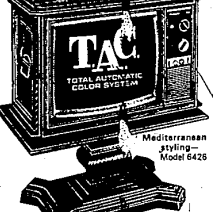
"One of these is the child's observable behavior, which is a definite communication about what's going on inside the child."

"When a child persists over an extended time in angry, depressed, frightened, guilty or deceptive behavior, he is communicating a problem that he's not solving and not growing beyond."

"A second source of information is the adult's own feelings and responses to the child."

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
