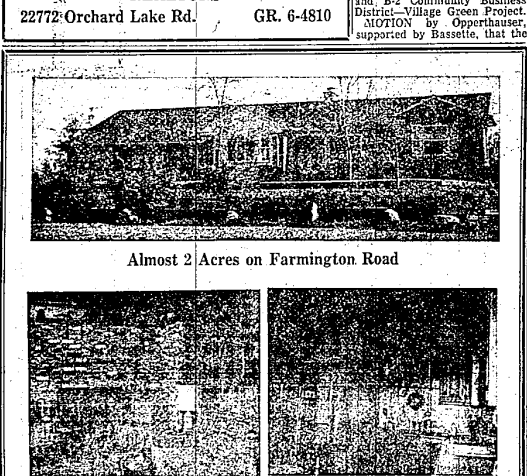

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## Township Of Farmington Board Proceedings

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington Township Board was called to order on November 23rd, A.D. 1964 at 8:01 p.m. by Mr. Carl Hall, Chairman. Members present were: Staff, Avery, Cairns, Bassette, Oppenheuser, Duke, and Walter. Also present was Mr. Joseph T. Brennan, Township Attorney. Public Hearing—Necessity for Sewers in Waddell, Wilcox, Rymal, Company's Kemberton Park Subdivision.

Acting under Act No. 188, as amended by Act No. 183, objections must be in writing, and only one letter objecting to sewers has been received—Mr. E. A. Troger.

There being no other objection, Mr. Hall declared the Public Hearing for necessity closed. Regular Meeting of the Township Board called to order at 8:30 p.m.

TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 20

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 20 of the Township of Farmington entitled: "An Ordinance enacted under Act 181, Public Acts of 1943, as amended, governing the unincorporated portions of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, to regulate and restrict the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and for public and semi-public or other specified uses; and to determine the size of yards, courts and a open spaces; to regulate and limit the density of population; and for said purposes to divide the Township into districts and establish the boundaries thereof; providing for changes in the regulations, restrictions and boundaries of such districts; defining certain terms used herein; providing for enforcement; establishing a Board of Appeals and imposing penalties for the violation of this Ordinance."

HERBERT ORDAINED by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:

That the zoning map of said Ordinance No. 20 of the Township of Farmington, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended to show ESD, B-2, RC Multiple, ESD Expressway Service and B-2 Community Business District—Village Green Project—where RA-1 district classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

SW¼ of SW¼, ex. S 50' in U.S. 16 Hwy. and E½ of SW¼ ex. S 50' in U.S. 16 Hwy. to be rezoned from R24 to RC Multiple, ESD Expressway Service and B-2 Community Business District—Village Green Project. One Family Residence except that part of the SW¼ of Sec 20, T2N, R9E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, as beginning at a point distant N 0 degrees 13' 00" W 415.25' thence S 68 degrees 37' 20" E 1130.91'; thence due W 1050.00' to the point of beginning; thence E 500' to ESD (Expressway Service District) containing 4.5 Acres; thence S 0 degrees 12' 28" E 622.32' to a pt. dis due E 622.32' of Sec 20, T2N, R9E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, as beg at a pt. dis due E 622.32' of Sec 20, T2N, R9E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, as beg at a pt. dis due E 1552.02' from the SW cor of Sec 20 and running thence N 0 degrees 16' 40" W 530'; thence due S 0 degrees 16' 40" W 530'; thence due W 1050' to the point of beg. Containing 2.0 acres, which is to be rezoned from R24 to B-2.

Also except that part of the SW¼ of Sec 20, T2N, R9E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, as beg at a pt. dis due E 1552.02' from the SW cor of Sec 20 and running thence N 0 degrees 16' 40" W 530'; thence due S 0 degrees 16' 40" W 530'; thence due W 1050' to the point of beg. Containing 2.0 acres, which is to remain RA-1.

Section Two.  
All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.
