Methodist Church Anniversary

The church at the present site, large in the beginning of its development and among its earliest institutions was the Methodist Church.
At first its meetings were held in the homes of the people, and later, in 1860, a frame church was built at the corner of Shawnee and Warner. Thirty-eight years later under the leadership of Rev. S. E. Warner, the building was enlarged and improved.
After a disastrous fire in 1920, Pastor Sidney D. Eva's inspired guidance was instrumental in building a new

church at the present site. Grand Central Methodist Church was dedicated in 1922. The new church was patterned after an early English style, suggestive of the old English Parish Church. Through the ensuing years many improvements and changes have been made.
During the growth of the Farmington Methodist Church the pastors were instrumental in forming other Methodist churches in the neighboring communities.
THE PASTORATE of Russell W. Sursaw encompassed a period of very rapid growth and activity. The plans for a new Educational Unit and for a new parsonage were completed. The old parsonage was razed and a new one was built in a newly opened subdivision a short distance from the church. Work in the Educational Unit was completed and the building was consecrated April 13, 1958.
Growth and change have continued during the administration of the church's present pastor, Richard T. Markham. Among the many changes, the sanctuary was enlarged providing additional seating capacity for 160 worshippers. The basement has been finished to provide more facilities for social functions and new assembly rooms have been provided for Junior and Adult choirs.
MRS. SIDNEY D. EVA joined the church staff as Parish Visitor and her work has been of great value to the entire church family. The need for an Associate pastor had been recognized for years and in July of this year, Reverend David R. Stone came to the church from the United Church of Canada and is primarily responsible for the work of religious education for the youth.
Methodists from near and far are expected to gather Sunday to participate in the 138th anniversary celebration of Farmington Methodist Church.

At 5 p.m. Iva Dail will demonstrate how to make a small table tree from styrofoam and pine cones. Beautiful pine wreaths will be made at 7 p.m. by Pearl Marks. The last demonstration on Saturday will be at 8 p.m. when Barbara Maxon makes Christmas corsages.
MRS. MAXON will repeat her corsage demonstration on Sunday at 1 p.m. At 2 p.m. on Sunday Sue Dwyer will demonstrate her technique for making jeweled eggs. This will be one of the highlights of the exhibit.
At 3 p.m. Bertha Simonsen will show how to make unusual table arrangements with candles. The last demonstration will be at 4 p.m. with Iva Dail repeating her methods for constructing a cone tree.

Ct. Restraining Order Lifted On Sewer Const.

Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Philip Pratt last Wednesday, November 25, lifted the restraining order on the Shelby Construction Company to allow the resumption of work on the Tarabusi Sewer Main in Farmington Township.
Stanley and Virginia Edwards of Meadowbrook Hills Subdivision, where some residents have been without water due to pumping on the site of the sewer construction which dried up wells, brought the suit against Farmington Township.
Judge Pratt, who issued the restraining order which halted construction in Meadowbrook Hills on Monday of last week, ruled there was no basis for continuing the stop work order.
