

Athletes Honored At 13th Annual Banquet

Mr. Al Weister, football All-American from the University of Michigan, was the guest speaker for the Clarenteville Optimist Club 13th Annual High School Athletic Banquet held at the Parker House on Monday, November 30. Speaking of his past as a football player on the great 1948 team of U. of M., Mr. Weister told of the importance of mental attitude, desire, and scholastic ability and their effect upon athletes.

Weister spoke of his problems of overcoming the fame his two All-American brothers had obtained before him. **HE CONCLUDED THE** program with a football film of this year's Michigan-Iowa game. This film, of course, showed Clarenteville's Tony Giacobazzi in action against the University of Michigan as a member of Iowa's team.

As a part of the evening's activities all Clarenteville letter winners were introduced by their respective coaches. James Bedson was named most valuable player for this past football season, and next year's captains were announced as Jim Prisk and Chris Hawkins. Omerson Nelson was named as most improved player for this past year.

Oakland College Names Men to Key Positions

The Board of Trustees of Oakland College has announced the appointment of two administrators for the new community college district formed recently for all of Oakland County. **THE FIRST CAMPUS** in the community college district will be located at the junction of E. and M-59 just east of Pontiac. An abandoned U.S. Nike base with all buildings still in good shape, it is expected that remodeling can be done in time to accommodate between 800 and 1,000 students at this campus site by September of 1965.

Responsible for the development of technical programs at Monroe Community College in Rochester. Prior to this he was director of technical and manpower education in the Colorado Dept. of Education and on the faculty of Colorado State University. Named as associate dean-technical education was Irving Levinson who has been professor of mechanical engineering at the Lawrence Institute of Technology since 1947. He has published textbooks on metallurgy, mechanics and the mechanics of materials and has been a consultant for a number of industries.

Levinson will work with the dean in developing technical education programs. **DR. ALBERT A. CANFIELD**, director of university and scientific relations of the Bendix Corp., has been appointed vice president for instruction of the Oakland Community College and will assume his new position on January 1. Dr. Canfield who lives in Royal Oak has been on the faculty of both Northwestern University and the School of Business Administration at Wayne State University. For the last five years he has had the responsibility of maintaining liaison with university administrators, faculty and placement officers and with scientific and engineering societies at the national, regional and local levels.

President Tirrell also reported that he is recommending Lloyd Van Buskirk, former Franklyn, Michigan as director of campus development. For the past four years Van Buskirk has been director of finance for the Birmingham Public Schools.


