

Lancer Wrestlers Meet East Detroit in Opener

The Our Lady of Sorrows wrestling team locked horns with the rugged grapplers of East Detroit for their opening dual meet of the 1964-65 season on December 3 and bowed to the home team, 33 to 25.

Lancer Coach Dan Potter had good reason to be proud of the showing made by his OLS wrestlers. However, as East Detroit had opened its season a week earlier and defeated a formidable Catholic Central squad.

All EXCEPT ONE of the 12 matches were decided by pins. The Lancers had five men win matches with pins while the East Detroit wrestlers earned six victories with pins and gained one on a decision.

The point-getters for Sorrows were:

- Mike Solar, at 120-pounds, pin in 3:55; Jerry Wroblewski, at 133-pounds, pin in 3:00; Rick Korte (Capt.), at 145-pounds, pin in 5:41; Greg Lourenco, at 154-pounds, pin in 1:30; and Terry Callorette, at 165-pounds, pin in 1:48.

Callorette's pin in the 150-pound division placed the Lancers even with East Detroit, 25-25. OLS lost a decision in the 180-pound match and had their heavyweight man pinned to end up on the short end of the 33-25 final score.

COACH POTTER commented that breaks could have gone either way in the match. OLS 's 6 STATE FINALS at last. He said Lancer wrestlers

had their opponents on their backs on several occasions before suffering reversals and getting taken down themselves.

In the Junior Varsity meet with East Detroit, the Lancer wrestlers fared much better and came away with an impressive 27 to 25 victory.

WINNERS FOR Sorrows in the JV meet were Tony Tucker, Tom Bitterle, John Hughes, Terry Ryland, Dave Thompson, Frank Walsh and Jim Potkay.

The Lancer wrestlers journeyed to Flat Rock for a dual meet on December 3 and face Country Day at OLS in their next dual meet action. The 4 p.m. meeting on December 15 with Country Day will be the final dual meet of the season.

Falcons Post Winning Football Season in '64

The Farmington High School football team recorded its first winning season in four years this fall, posting a respectable 5-3-1 record. The victories were posted over Plymouth, Bentley, Pontiac Northern, Riverside and Southfield. The Falcon eleven tied neighborhood rival North Farmington, 0-0, to close out their 1964 gridiron campaign and bowed to Conference Champions Walled Lake, Waterford and East Detroit in their three extra games.

Roy "Cowboy" Leach led the Falcon ball carriers in scoring as he crossed enemy goal stripes ten times during the season for a total of 60 points for Farmington. The husky fullback plowed for 510 yards in 109 carries for an impressive 4.7 yards per chance.
