Campus Near or In Farmington Being Planned

A community college campus in the western part of Southfield or more likely in Farmington somewhere near the route of the I-696 expressway is being recommended for the near future by Dr. John E. Tirrell, president of the newly formed Oakland Community College District.

This recommendation was made along with a number of others by the college district's president at a progress report meeting held earlier this month in Milford.

The first of three campus sites proposed in the district has already been acquired and is located on property at the interchange of I-75 and the new M-59 route near Pontiac. With buildings already on this site, it is planned to have them remodeled and put into use to accommodate between 800 and 1,000 students by September of 1965.

Dr. Tirrell cited the need as soon as possible for a good sized campus in the southeastern portion of the county where the population concentration is very heavy. He expressed hope that some facilities in that area could be ready by September of 1966 and major construction on facilities to handle as many as 3,500 students could be completed by the fall of 1967.

THE COLLEGE head stated that he was hopeful that the third campus in the western part of Southfield or in Farmington Township could be developed and ready to handle as many as 3,500 pupils by the fall of 1970.

Dr. Tirrell emphasized that it is planned to offer technical, vocational and development and counseling training programs at the campus as well as academic and general education programs.

Progress reports in various communities throughout the county are planned to be made as development of the Oakland Community College District moves ahead, Dr. Tirrell emphasized.

Arthur Sheehan Turned Over To Livonia on Murder Charge

Farmington Township Police scene. Sgt. John Polder, and officers Jack Brown and Al Gula from Farmington Township arrived in time to assist in making the arrest on Sheehan.

Sheehan, an ex-convict who served 22 years for fatally shooting a Detroit policeman in 1952 and later served another 7½ years on an armed robbery conviction, was arrested last Thursday night by Farmington Township Police after he had broken into the home of Donald Thorner of 37330 Rhinewood in Farmington Township.

SHEEHAN, who was out on \$1,000 bond on a breaking and entering charge in Dearborn, was discovered by the Thorners when they returned from shopping on December 10. While Mr. Thorner was still in his garage, Mrs. Thorner was ordered at gunpoint by Sheehan to "keep quiet." Sheehan ordered Mrs. Thorner into an upstairs bedroom and made his escape out of the house.

Mrs. Thorner ran down to the garage and told her husband they had been robbed and in a charge of attempted murder. Sheehan in his car. The chase ended near Seven Mile and Newburg Road in Livonia where Sheehan abandoned his car and began fleeing on foot across a field. Thorner and a motorist who stopped to assist in the chase, Thomas Skinner, 19, of Detroit, succeeded in wrestling Sheehan to the ground and subduing him, but not until Sheehan had fired five shots from a .32 caliber pistol in an attempt to discourage pursuit.

DETECTIVE RUSS Conway of the Farmington Township Police Department was the first police officer to arrive on the scene.

20 Complaints In Twp. Closed

Farmington Township Police cleared up 20 complaints ranging from prowling to window peeping with the arrest of Ben Gene Bowers, 24, of 950 Wolverine in Walled Lake.

Bowers was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Allen C. Ingles in a charge of attempted breaking and entering. At his examination on November 30 in Judge Ingles' Court, Bowers admitted a total of 40 complaints registered in the communities of Farmington, Walled Lake, West Bloomfield and the Oakland County Sheriff's Department and the Michigan State Police.

Bond was set by Judge Ingles at \$5,000 and Bowers was bound over for trial in Oakland County by Circuit Court. Detective Russ Conway of the Farmington Township Police was credited with clearing up the complaints charged to Bowers.

Special Tax Levy Questioned

Mrs. Bernard B. questioned at the regular Township Board meeting Monday night the special levy made on current tax bills for the extension of sewer facilities up into the industrial park area in the western portion of the township.
