The Yale Yule Log Game  
The Farmington and North Farmington High School football teams fought to a 0-0 tie in the final game of the season for both schools. Funds raised in this first Old Yale Log Benefit Game will be split between the School District and a fund to purchase Christmas lights for the community.  
All-County Honors  
Tom Mitchell, and for Farmington, North Farmington guard Skip Moore were named to the All-County Football Team. Falcons Dick Johnson, Mike Nichols, Les Martella, Bruce Charles, Dick Lessway, Mike Freeman and Mike Perry all received All-County Honorable Mention. Candidates included Andy Lawing and John McDonald received All-County honors along with Skip Moore.  
Village Green Official  
The Farmington Township Board, following the recommendation of the Zoning Board, approved the proposed Village Green apartment house located at 13 mile and 13 mile roads on November 23.  
Water Project

New Grade School  
The new Lakeshire Elementary School on Tuck Road was put under construction by the Farmington School District Board of Education and it was hoped the new facilities would be completed in time to be open to students in the fall of 1965 to avoid half-day sessions for an estimated 400 Farmington pupils.  
Awarded Medal  
Capt. John T. Buck of Farmington was awarded the U.S. Air Force Air Medal for his part in a record-breaking flight of F-100 jet fighters over the Gulf of Mexico from Florida to Turkey.  
Peace Corps  
Miss Myrlene Dowling of Farmington is to assume duties as a school teacher in Malawi, Africa with the U.S. Peace Corps. Marjorie Land, The City's classroom teacher, is also taking up missions with the Peace Corps.  
Chandler Dies  
Senior-citizen Paul Chandler of Livonia died December 12, stricken with a heart attack at his home, 17515 Southampton.

Old Newsboys

Heart Attack  
Proves Fatal  
To 20-Year-Old  
Steve C. Heath of 22169 Averhill Street in Farmington Township died suddenly December 28 of a heart attack. He was 20 years old on December 18. Cause of death was attributed to a heart attack.  
A 1963 graduate of Farmington Senior High School, where he was a varsity football player and member of the FHS wrestling team, Heath had been employed by Houtzelle Industries of Detroit.  
"Young Heath is survived by his mother, Mrs. Esther Young; three sisters, Mrs. Russ (Rose Mary) Baker of Farmington and Judy Heath and Priscilla Young, both at home; and a brother, Randy Heath. Funeral services were held Wednesday at 1 p.m. in the Hammond-Hass Funeral Home, 24501 Fenkel Avenue in Detroit. The Rev. Winston Decker, pastor of the Covenant Community Church of Detroit, officiated at the funeral services. Interment took place in the Hill Memorial Cemetery in Novi, Michigan.

Funeral Services Held  
For World War II Hero  
Funeral services were held Monday, December 28, for World War II hero Howard J. Lock, 41, of 28071 Ridgeway Drive in Kendallwood, Farmington Township.  
Mr. Lock served under the late Gen. Claire C. Chennault with American forces in China, Lock was cited for outstanding individual bravery in demolishing an air base at Luichow as American forces withdrew from it in the face of a Japanese advance in November of 1944.  
Mr. LOCK, a plant engineer with Chrysler Corporation, was fatally injured in an automobile accident in Detroit on October 26. His car struck a utility pole at Grand River and Northrop.  
Twenty years ago Lock and his wife, Mrs. Mary, formed the demolition team of the 491st Bomber Group based at Luichow, China. The group was assigned to destroy the base after the evacuation of American bomber and fighter aircraft.  
In three days, Lock's demolition team bombed and destroyed wiring mechanisms to delay the Japanese to find the base. The group was assigned to destroy the base after the evacuation of American bomber and fighter aircraft.  
A rosary service was held at 6 p.m. on Sunday at St. Mary's Church, 22250 Grand River Avenue, Detroit. Services were held at 9 a.m. on Monday from the funeral home at 19 a.m. at St. Fabian Church in Farmington where Lock had been an usher. Burial took place at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Detroit.
