Farmington Township Police To Receive Two New Dodges

Official action was taken by the Township Board at a special session on Saturday morning of last week to acquire two new Dodge interceptors for the Farmington and Country Dodge of Farmington for two new Dodge interceptors for cars.

The action was taken on the recommendation of four of the seven members of the Township Board, who had been instructed following bid openings earlier this month to make a study of all bids and report back.

Those making the study did not feel that the police department's preference for Pontiac cars could be justified at the price advantage of the bid made by the local Dodge dealer.

A \$1,600 trade-in allowance was given for one car to be turned in by the township cutting the total cost to the township for the two new Dodges to \$18,187.40.

Educators aware of the value of music appreciation in schooling are enthusiastic in commending the Farmington Kiwanis Club for bringing Rubinoff and his famed Stradivarius to the Farmington Junior High School Auditorium on January 15.

Rubinoff will appear in two concerts; a matinee for students and faculty members, as well as the younger students of the grade and parochial schools of the community and outlying districts, and an evening concert for the general public.

FIRST CONCERT artist to bring the music led direct to the boys and girls of school age; Rubinoff's special matinee will have been heartily received by teenagers throughout the country.
