from \$10,000 to \$15,000 annually and raises for the clerk and treasurer from \$8,500 to \$11,500 and \$11,000, respectively, are justified.

"THIS ACTION was taken by the four trustees on the Board without the participation of the full title officials," was the comment of Trustee Arthur Bassette, "all of us are businessmen. We know how much a job is worth and it was our considered opinion that the salaries we set represent a fair and proper compensation for the difficult and important work of guiding a growing community like Farmington."

Trustee Byron Walter added, "Our study of other communities of comparable size and with similar problems convinced us that adequate salaries are a must if we are to attract top flight people to local government. Farmington has been lucky to have the competent officials we have had for the money we have been paying. We should emphasize too, that these salaries were fixed prior to the election and would have gone to whom ever had been elected. We have grave doubts that any referendum petiti as would have been circulated if the Democrat candidates had won."

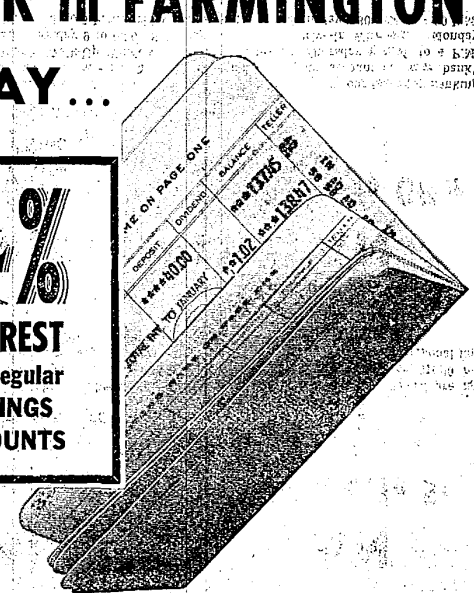
