

### 4,000 Attend International Kiwanis Anniversary Party

## Arrow Auto Wash Grand Opening Continues Through Sat., Feb. 13

Now in its second big week of Grand Opening festivities, the new, ultra modern Arrow Auto Wash is featuring prizes of television sets and radios for lucky visitors.

Located at the corner of Grand River and Orchard Lake roads, the auto wash will offer a first prize of a color television set, a second prize of a portable TV, and 25 transistor radios for third prizes in a drawing to be held after the Grand Opening ends on February 13. There will also be gifts for all customers during this time.

MANY LOCAL citizens have already visited the business, which actually opened its doors to the public on Dec. 30, 1964. T. B. Greenbury, owner of Arrow Auto Wash, explained that he had delayed the Grand Opening in order to accumulate a competent crew and to streamline the operation to give truly clean cars to his customers.

"We have the newest and best equipment on the market today, we have incorporated every safety feature possible, and we employ a chemist to analyze our soaps, detergents, and waxes. In addition, we have made every effort to eliminate any interference with the radio," Mr. Greenbury said.

The auto wash is affiliated with Standard Oil, and the prime, Arrow Wash is reduced according to the volume of gas purchased.

"With a full crew, we have equipment and capacity to clean more than 100 cars every hour," Mr. Greenbury said, "and we normally employ between 25 and 40 men daily. Even then we have no problems with street traffic because we have such a large stacking area for our cars."

CARS MAY ENTER from either Orchard Lake Road or Grand River. Drivers stop first at the gas pumps and then drive to the back of the property, where an employee takes the car, while the owner can browse in the beautifully carpeted soundproof lobby, listen to piped-in music, watch his car through conveniently located windows, or look over the auto accessories offered for sale.

Meanwhile the car is going through approximately 20 cleaning operations. First the car is steamed, floor mats are taken out and scrubbed, and the inside of the car is vacuumed. Then it passes through large air doors which maintain constant temperature and humidity control inside the building.

Next the car goes through a power wash which features a high-pressure spray to loosen grime. Automatic wheel washers move in to steam-clean wheels. As the car leaves the wheel washers, large brushes spread a detergent along the sides and top. Then the car moves to the sudser which dispenses a special detergent for the final washing. This detergent is spread on the car by six men who use hand brushes and scrub to insure a real cleaning. Two of these stand-ins get the lower chassis and rocker panels, two clean the upper area and windows and two the front and back including the grill and bumpers. The car then moves through a final power rinse, is sprayed with jet wax, and finally passes through two blowers, one on 80
