Cost Estimates On Sewers Done

Cost estimates for extending adequate sanitary sewer lines into the area between Grand River Avenue and Nine Mile Road, and between Middlebelt Road and Inkster from Grand River to Shawwassee Road have now been completed.

This was the report given to the Township Board Monday night by Clerk Floyd Cairns.

Official resolutions calling for the establishment of special assessment districts in these two areas have yet to be drawn up and published and public hearings held. It is expected that these resolutions will be ready for formal action in the near future and that the dates for public hearings will be able to be set shortly afterwards.
