Petitioner requests and the Zoning Board considers that the following described property be rezoned as outlined by the following descriptions:
The property is a part of a recorded plat and located in the SE1/4 of Section 36, T1N, R9E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan. It is generally known as the Botsford Inn Company property having a postal address of 28000 Grand River Ave., Farmington, Michigan and is between Oxford Street and Colwell Street, north of Grand River. The rezoning applicant is the Botsford Inn Company, John W. Anhalt, President, (Assessor List F619A, 6 & c and Anhalt Hotels, Assessor List F619D, 9 & c).

The request is to rezone a portion from present RA-4 single residential classification to R-3 multiple residential classification which consists of 8.50 acres, as outlined by submitted blueprint. It fronts on Colwell St. with a rear extension to Grand River Ave. Apartments are planned.
The request in part is to also rezone two portions from present RA-4 single residential to B-3 general business classification because the actual usage has been a recognized permissible variance of such usage and additions present B-3 zoning, as is shown by submitted print. One of these B-3 requests fronts on Colwell St. and includes the present coach house, a pool and garden area and part of the Inn building. The other B-3 request fronts on 251.76 ft on Oxford St. and includes five present motel units. The adjoining presently commercial zoning mentioned is the present 500 foot depth along Grand River Ave. that already has commercial zoning.
