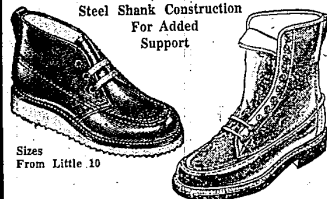

## To Speak On 'New Math' at Beechview Sch.

Modern mathematics, the new educational program now being considered for introduction in Farmington schools, will be discussed by Dr. David Wells, director of mathematics education for Oakland County Schools, at Beechview Elementary School, Monday, March 15, at 8 p.m.

Harold E. Shipple, president of the Beechview Parent-Teacher Association said Dr. Wells' appearance is in response to the growing interest of parents in this new approach to teaching arithmetic.

A RECOGNIZED authority in his field, Dr. Wells has authored mathematics textbooks and many articles concerning the teaching of mathematics. He is a part-time faculty member for the University of Michigan, a member of the board of directors for the Central Association of Science and Mathematics Teachers and a member of the State Mathematics Curriculum Committee.

Parents and teachers from other Farmington area schools who would like to know more about the new math program are invited to hear Dr. Wells.

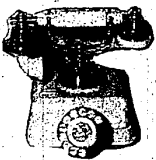
