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Truck Traffic Problem Aired

Warner Street is beginning to break up, Nelson stated, and the situation will become much worse when spring arrives. His request was that the city correct the steps be taken.

It was pointed out during discussion that the city recently adopted an ordinance prohibiting all large trucks on residential streets but that signs have not as yet been received to that this restriction can be fully posted.

Director of public safety, stated that he felt little could be done to prevent big trucks from using these streets until the signs are received and installed.

City Manager Diman said that if Nelson got the names of the trucking firms using Warner and Oakland that he would see to it that the owners were contacted and that they instruct their drivers not to use these residential streets in the future.
