Model U-N Bloc Meeting Held

Room 116-B of Farmington Senior High was filled a week ago Tuesday afternoon by over 160 high school students from southeastern Michigan and Ontario. The occasion for their visit to Farmington was the first Model United Nations bloc meeting ever held at F.H.S. The bloc meeting was called by the Farmington Model U.N. delegation which will represent France at the mock General Assembly at the University of Detroit this April. All "Friends of France in Africa, Asia, and Latin America" were invited, including the Ivory Coast, the other Farmington delegation. The bloc meeting began with the registration of the twenty-six delegations who attended. Registration was supervised by two French delegates, Ron Lee and Pete MacDonald. The general meeting began at 4:30 p.m. Steve Heston, co-chairman of Farmington's M.U.N. and French chairman, ran the meeting with the assistance of Jerry Wagner, Farmington M.U.N. Secretary. Treasurer and French floor manager. A touchy situation developed immediately after Heston opened the meeting and stated France's purpose for calling it. An Indonesian delegate read a statement by Indonesia, the Malagasy Republic and Kenya, calling France a "neo-colonialist nation" that was calling a neutralist caucus only to seize control of the neutral bloc's votes. The charge was answered by Wagner, who explained that France was interested only in nations' opinions, not their votes. The meeting then took up a discussion of the most pressing item on the U. of D. agenda, the U.N. budget. Main participants were Indonesia, Guatemala and the Ivory Coast. After the general meeting, the delegates broke up into committee meetings, each committee considering a separate agenda item. The committees were chaired by French delegates Pete MacDonald, Gary Heide, Steve Heston, Jerry Wagner, and Ron Lee; they were attended by Ivory Coast delegates Mike Miller, Perry Jamieson, and Bill Hix. Neither France nor Ivory Coast encountered any serious trouble in committee, although Wagner and Jamieson drew some fire. French delegation secretary
