Add Job Needs To May Census

Questions pertaining to vocational-educational needs in the Farmington area will be included in the May school census. The study will be conducted in all of Oakland County school districts in order to better provide for the future needs in these areas.

The survey cost will be covered by a \$5,000 Federal grant and by staff and office time provided by Oakland school districts, according to David H. Saule, vocational-educational director of Oakland schools.

The number of employed and employable persons in each household will be listed on the census blanks along with job preferences, job training status, and the need and desire for training or retraining.

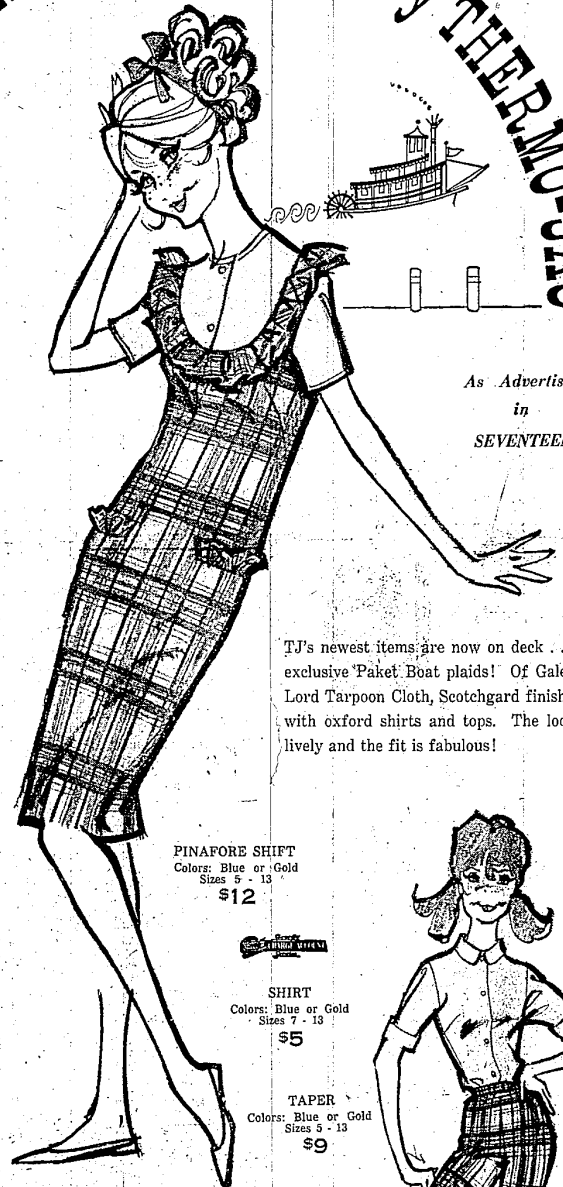
