## Adult Education Speech Class Being Offered in Spring Term

(Editor's note: The following article was prepared by Mr. C. B. Shevbridge, speech instructor for the Farmington Adult Education Program.)

Remember that lousy political speech you heard and and about the last speaker at the PMA who droned on and on without really saying anything? Remember the last social function you attended when you felt inadequate to communicate with those around you? Remember those bull sessions on your street last summer when you just stood there frustrated while everyone else seemed to mix conversation with ease? Seems to me there was a meeting you attended where you were just itching to jump to your feet and eloquently express your feelings but you didn't because you felt your own ineptitude to so communicate. Don't forget the wife who would not benefit from a speech course than simply improving speaking techniques. For instance speech training can eliminate some of the bad habits that cause friction and tension between us and others. Further it helps us perfect ourselves in new roles which increase our adaptability and social usefulness.

It can especially do these things because the factors of personality are more intimately woven into the educational process in the speech class than in any other school area. One of the primary benefits of speech training, then, is the strengthening of personality.

The fact that the human personality is a social product which grows, develops and achieves refinement as it comes in contact with other human beings coupled with the fact that speech is the most significant form of social interaction are excellent reasons for speech training. For not only are speech techniques improved but the personality is enhanced also.

SINCE SPEECH is a communicative manifestation of personality, then personality exists only as an interaction with other persons through the medium of speech. Therefore, the better one speaks, the better one projects his personality.

If speech is the very essence of our work-a-day world, the lack of proper training in these oral skills severely handicaps our efforts in the social world. Good speech training is most helpful in gaining poise, that inward calmness we all seek in our relations with others.

Finally, since we all live in a society of free speech and are frequently called upon to express ourselves concerning political, economic, social, and religious issues of the day, sufficient preparation in public speaking makes us more effective in talking it out. We Americans are always trying to sell our issues in this way. But free speech is only good when it is effective.

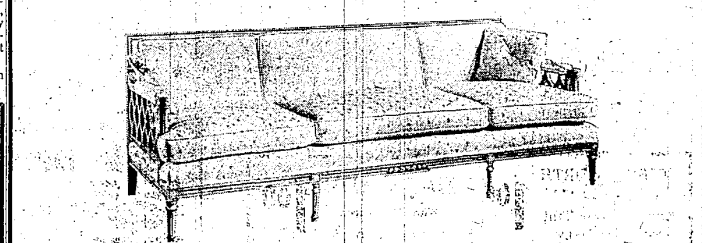
