Arts, Crafts, Trades Offered at Jr. High

The Farmington schools curriculum provides seventh graders with an introduction to a wide variety of arts, crafts and trades. A report presented to the Board of Education on March 22, described the programs which vary from school to school but are basically the same.

The art program for seventh graders consists of three units: color, perspective, and form. The aim of the color unit is to help the students see a relationship between colors. This is learned by the making of color wheels and by the mixing of warm and cool colors, harmonious colors, and complementary colors. Students apply their knowledge in watercolor painting.

THE SECOND UNIT is perspective drawing, either one point or two point. Buildings are drawn in a variety of media. The third unit is a form or craft unit. The main areas are sculpture, printing, and construction. The unit stresses the creative use of common materials.

Other units, design, figure drawing, or watercolor painting, are added depending on the length of the marking period.

Seventh grade Home Economics is taught to boys as well as to girls. The first unit of the course stresses family relations. Getting along with each other and the importance of good manners and good grooming are taught. Students are given home projects—various household duties—and are told ways in which they can be helpful at home.

THE SECOND UNIT is clothing, with emphasis on the care of clothing. Students are taught the importance of being independent. They learn to hand wash a garment and also to machine wash. They learn spot removal techniques, how to sew on buttons, and how to iron clothing. Students are reminded that "mothers are not meant to be made."

The third unit is on foods. This unit covers table manners, table setting, nutrition, helping at home, politeness at the table, planning of time and work, and kitchen safety. A foods project is carried out. The industrial arts program for the seventh grade is exploratory in nature and is not intended as a course for de-
