Apts., Two Subs Approved By Township Zoning Board

Plans for an apartment development and two subdivisions were approved by the Township Zoning Board at a regular meeting on March 25. The apartment development, approved by a split vote, will be located in the southwest quarter of section 28, on 22 acres northwest of Gill and Nine Mile roads. The proponents, Smokier Co., plan to erect 233 units on the site. The report by Villian-Leman, planning consultants, stated that the multiple housing planned would be a "desirable treatment for the property."

Grace Richardson's motion to approve the request was seconded by James Skillman. David Mills voted for approval. Charles Lorian abstained, and Charles Hannan and Charles Williams voted against approval.

HERITAGE HILLS Subdivision, plans for which have been reviewed and revised several times, was given unanimous approval by the Township Zoning Board. The development, to be located in the north half of section 4, south of 14 Mile Road between Farmington and Drake roads, will be built by Les Taubman of the Charter Land Company. Plans call for 317,

Early American type, single family homes to be built on the 176 acre site. Also approved unanimously was the Colony Park Subdivision to be developed on 101 acres southwest of Thirteen Mile and Farmington roads in the northeast quarter of section 9. Mac-Cline, proponents, plan to erect 182 single-family homes on the site. They will be predominantly two-story colonial type buildings.

Plans for the three developments will now be presented to the Township Board for final approval.

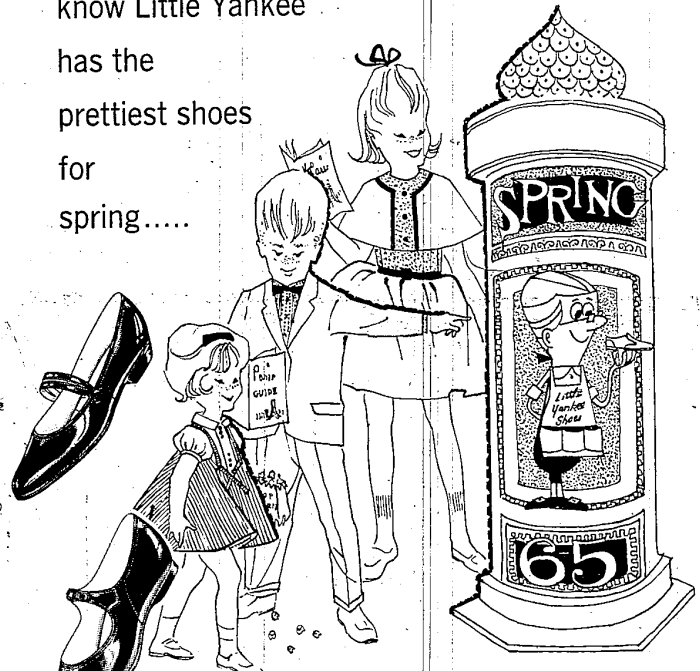
