Scorched Leaves?

Leaf scorch, an irregular browning of the leaves on your trees, is caused by the inability of the tree's root system to return moisture lost at the leaf surface, according to Gerald Draheim Michigan State University horticultural Wayne County.

Although the scorched condition cannot be rectified, watering the tree to a depth of 18 to 24 inches with a soaker or very slow running sprinkler, will restore the health of the tree.

In addition, insect and disease control, fertilization in early spring or late fall, and proper tile dralnage will help the tree grow vigorously and prevent leaf scorch.

Because of the giant size of their bright blooms these make a striking accent plant. Clumps tend to grow larger and produce more stems and-blooms each year.

One of the newest kinds which was an "All-America" silver medal winner a couple of years ago is a variety known as Southern Belle. The while or rose flowers have a contrasting red "eye" in the center of each huge bloom.

The tall spires can add a great deal of interest to the garden. They can be used to good advantage along a fence or garage wall, or at the back of a mixed flower border.

Completing the family circle is Okra, a member of the hibiscus family that Ig grown for its edible pods. All though this is primarily grown in the south, it can be grown in gardens in this area, too.
