# Parents, Kids Join New MSU Conference

Mothers can learn about child care and children and teens can discuss problems parents in a new type program scheduled Aug. 13 on the Michigan State University campus.

"Young Family Day" is an experimental project being presented by 4-H youth and Family Living Education programs as part of the Cooperative Extension Service national extension Home-makers Council Aug. 13 to 16.

For parents only there will be a class in quality child care, Mrs. Kathy Buton, Wayne County extension home economist said.

Taught by Alice Whiren, MSU instructor in family and child sciences, it will go into the respective merits of home care, a day care center, family day care homes, housekeeper and A.D.C.

"Child care is probably one of the biggest consumer problems we have today," said Mrs. Whiren, discussing the class.

"Decisions about child care often are made out of desperation, with little or no knowledge of the alternatives and their consequences."

Other Young Family Day classes for parents include marital enrichment, the changing role of women in today's families, moving and its effects on the family and the economics involved in having children.

Classes for children and youth range from "How to Deal with Problem Parents," for children 12 and older, to a pre-school program.

For the whole family, there are classes on infant and toddler enrichment, sports, "A Family Look at Ecology" and "Parent-Child Communication."
