Road Problem

This is in regard to the story that appeared recently concerning our streets in Farmington Township. Mother nature was blamed for the condition of the streets. She is, working overtime. I have called about our street since December. We have lived here for six years and in that time there has never been one problem of granite put on our street.

As for work being done on sewer and water lines, there certainly has been any time around here, yet we paid the sewer bill four years ago. We have been unable to travel our street for over a month now. We have repair bills on our car for using the street, plus an ambulance bill for \$40 to get my husband out of here and to a doctor.

My husband had surgery for cancer of the lung at University Hospital. When he was released in February, we were driven to Ann Arbor five days a week for him to receive cobalt treatments. I called Pontiac and asked for something to be done about our street. A man came to our home and told us there was nothing they could do.

I called Township Hall and got no satisfaction. My husband's treatments were delayed. I called the Fire Dept. to see if they would come and take us out to our car. When we returned from Ann Arbor they would bring us home. This condition is not the fault of our firemen. I have nothing but praise for them. In the past I have called on them a number of times since my husband suffered a heart condition. They were always here in minutes and stayed until his breathing had improved.

I think all residents should remember the mud we have lived in for weeks now and that our children had to dredge through it and from school.

I cannot understand how there can be funds for pay raises and no funds for our streets. We were asked to pay for the gravel to put on our street. Why should we when it is public? We live on Whittington between Shiawassee and Independence and this is used by school buses also and with God's help and the wonderful doctor at U.M. Hospital my husband is recovering.
