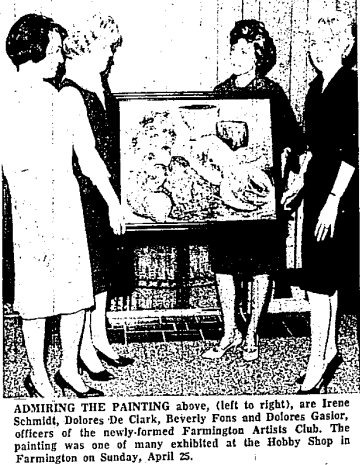

The Clarenceville School Scene

All voters in the Intermediate Oakland County School District, including Clarenceville, will be asked to vote on a millage issue at the Annual School Election, June 14.

At the present time a 1/2 mill is being collected by Oakland County for the operation of the Special Education Program. At the June election voters will indicate their choice of continuing the rate at 1/2 mill or increasing the rate to 1 full mill. This 1/2 mill increase will cost the taxpayer fifty cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation as equalized. Current figures released by the Oakland County Board of Education office show a need for 106 more special education classrooms. These classrooms cost about \$20,000 each and are paid for by the Special Education Millage.

In the Clarenceville School District four Special Education rooms are in operation this school year. Two of these rooms are located at Grandview Elementary while the other two are at the Junior and senior high. They are under the direction of specially trained instructors and use educational materials designed for their classwork.

Mrs. Lois Benedict, senior high school, Special Education instructor, was recently honored for her work in this area by being selected as one of the top ten working women of Livonia. Others honored have been given to the Clarenceville Special Education instructors by their selection for local, state, and national committees, conferences, and study programs.

In addition to these classrooms, the Clarenceville School District is able to send students to special education classes for the blind and partially sighted, deaf and hard of hearing, physically handicapped, speech correction, adjusted study program, and make use of the homebound teacher.
