Two innings made the difference in last week's baseball match between Farmington and Redford Union. The Falcons held a 3-2 edge entering the sixth inning but chaos broke loose and everything went wrong for Farmington as Redford scored five runs in each of the two remaining innings to walk away with a 12-3 victory.

"We played a darn good ball game for five innings," was the only comment Coach Steve Branz had after his players suffered their second straight defeat in as many

starts. The first loss came at the hands of Royal Oak Kimball, April 13, as the Falcon "9" was shutout 7-0.

Redford Union combined seven hits, three walks, and five Falcon errors in the two-inning spurt. Jim Kendrick, Redford "bush-leaguer," was the one man who dominated the game as he boomed out a 2-run triple and a 3-run homer.

Dick Johnston, All-Conference catcher, gave a try at the other end of the battery. In his pitching debut he allowed 10 hits and three walks. Out of the 12 runs scored against him, only six were earned.

Frank Melert made a brief appearance on the mound as he faced two batters and allowed two hits.
