Spencer J. Heeney Funeral Home Sold To Walter E. Sundquist of Farmington

Mrs. Florence Heeney this week announced the sale of the Spencer J. Heeney Funeral Home of Farmington to Mr. Walter E. Sundquist of Farmington Township.

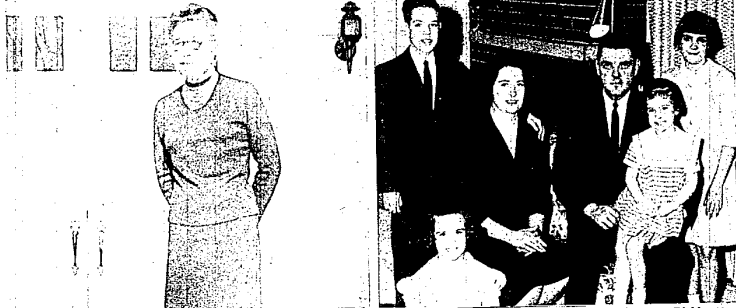
In announcing the sale of the business, established in the community some one-hundred years ago, Mrs. Heeney emphasized she would still continue to take an active part in the operation of the business, located at 23729 Farmington Road in Downtown Farmington, a block north of Grand River Avenue.

MR. SUNDQUIST, who makes his home at 32121 Baintree in Farmington Township with his wife, Charline, and their four children, has been the manager of the Ross B. Northrop and Son Funeral Home in Detroit for the past eight years. He was associated with the Neely Funeral Home and the Sutton Funeral Home prior to assuming the position of manager at Northrop.

A graduate of Wayne State University's College of Mortuary Science (1949), Sundquist served from 1942-45 with the U.S. Navy in the South Pacific. He entered Ferris Institute in Big Rapids, Michigan upon completion of his military duty. He has more than 15 years experience in the funeral business and is 39 years old.

MRS. SUNDQUIST is the former Charline Birney of Jackson, Michigan. She is a graduate of the Henry Ford Hospital School of Nursing (RN). Her husband is a native of Crystal Falls, located in the upper peninsula of Michigan.

The four Sundquist children are Rickie, 11, Margo, 9, Colleen, 7, and Marsha, 3. The Sundquists have resided in Farmington Township for the past three years and previously made their home in Redford Township.

Heeney Funeral Home, under the new management, will be known as the Heeney-Sundquist Funeral Home and Mrs. Heeney will continue to have an active role in the business.

Mrs. Heeney Remains Active Under New Management

Mrs. Florence Heeney, who has owned and managed the Spencer J. Heeney Funeral Home in Farmington since her husband's death two years ago, plans to remain active in the business under the new owner and manager Walter E. Sundquist.

Mrs. Heeney will shortly move into a newly built home in Farmington Township's Pleasant Valley Subdivision but will continue to maintain her active interest in the community and business started by her husband in 1914.

The Spencer J. Heeney Funeral Home is one of the community's oldest surviving businesses. Mr. Spencer Heeney's brother, William E. Heeney, purchased the business, which had operated for several decades under various managements, in 1914. In 1921, Mr. Spencer Heeney purchased the business from William E. Heeney who left to go into business for himself in Marquette, Michigan.

Mrs. Heeney, who became a licensed funeral director on August 4, 1944, has always taken an active part in the business. She has also been active at various times in many civic organizations including the Farmington Business and Professional Women's Club, American Legion Auxiliary, Groves-Walker Post 346 of Farmington; The Order of Eastern Star, Chapter No. 49 of Farmington; The Rebekah Lodge, No. 482 of Novi; and the Farmington Garden Club.

MRS. HEENEY is a Charter Member of the Farmington Sororist Club and was named the "Business Woman of the Year" by the Farmington Business and Professional Women's Club in 1953-54. At one time she served as Treasurer of the Farmington Eastern Star Chapter and has held various other offices in her civic group associations.

ADDITIONS WERE first made to the Heeney building in 1936. More re-modeling was accomplished in 1948 and another major remodeling phase was opened in 1959. The bent grass lawn was put in more than 25 years ago and has been maintained in top condition down through the years.

The Heeney Funeral Home has been noted over the years for its well-kept bent grass lawn and immaculate facade.

Mrs. Heeney, who like her late husband is a native of Plymouth, Michigan, has two married daughters, Jerree of Plymouth and Joyce of Glen Rock, New Jersey. She has three granddaughters and one grandson.
