acre, under the ordinance revisions.

Percy Gardhouse, chairman, said that the board has no authority to make exceptions once the ordinance goes into effect. He said that the ordinance must be approved by the Township Board, which will take time, and that any site plan approved between then and the effective date would be in the RC-3, 14 units per acre, classification.

Bill Bowman, representing the Kendallwood Corporation, appeared at the April 29 special meeting with a site plan. He stated that the requested density for the area will be necessary since the college has no dormitories planned but does have tuition rates for out-of-county and out-of-state students. Also, there will be need for living quarters for teachers.

The board received the site plan and referred it to Villanueva, planning consultants, for their recommendations.

Wild Car Chase Ends in N'ville

A wild car chase through downtown Farmington was climaxed early Monday morning with the arrest in Northville of 22-year-old Dennis Patrick Smith of 18408 Ashton in Detroit.

Smith, who was stopped by Farmington Township Police Officer George Maier at Orchard Lake Road and Ten Mile at 1:20 a.m. on Monday, was over his driver's license and the registration to his 1965 Oldsmobile and then assaulted Officer Maier, saying "This is the last time you'll see me alive."

SMITH THEN JUMPED back in his own car and sped south on Orchard Lake Road at a high rate of speed.

City Police Officer Michael Guilmette who was patrolling on Orchard Lake Road witnessed the assault on Officer Maier and immediately gave chase. He followed Smith's car at speeds up to and over 100 miles-an-hour west on Grand River Avenue and through the Downtown Farmington Center parking lot where City Officer Ronald Watson joined the chase.

SMITH "FISH-TAILED" through the Center parking lot and out onto Farmington Road where he headed south to Eight Mile, running a red light at that intersection and turning west on Eight Mile Road.

Two Northville Police Officers Westfall and Young joined Officers Guilmette and Watson in the chase west on Eight Mile and managed to get along side of Smith's car and heard him say, "You'll have to shoot me to stop me."

Smith's car was finally boxed in by the three pursuing police cars in Northville on Eight Mile Road. He rammed the front of Officer Guilmette's police car and attempted to rundown Officer Watson who was and left his car in front blocking his escape and was approaching him on foot.

OFFICER WATSON was assaulted by Smith who then turned on Officer Guilmette and was quickly subdued. Smith was treated at Botsford General Hospital for a laceration on his lip which required 17 stitches.

Jaycees had already authorized funds from their organization general fund to install three more 20 foot sections of bleachers at the main diamond in the park. The bleachers, which will cost about \$420 and seat approximately 200, have already been ordered, City Manager John Dinan informed councilmen.

On the problem of poor water facilities at the park, the city manager was instructed to investigate into the cost of putting in special lines with adequate control boxes to provide a supply of hose water for field maintenance work and also to determine what might be done to provide more drinking fountains.

On the Baseball for Boys officials' request for a soft drink stand, the city manager said that he saw this as no problem. Such stands have been permitted in past years, he pointed out.

Manager Dinan questioned the advisability of sodding the baseball diamond infield as requested by the Baseball for Boys officials but agreed to investigate into the cost of doing so as suggested and report back to the Council at the earliest possible date.

breakdown must still be made to determine the approximate cost for each benefiting property owner and then a cost estimate second public hearing held. Supervisor Curt Hall estimated it would probably take four or five weeks of work before the cost estimate hearing could be held.

He also emphasized the fact that time would be needed to get approval on the project from the Municipal Finance Commission and then to sell the bonds and to get bids on the construction work. Hall made it clear that the time required to do this was completely out of his or any other township officials control.
