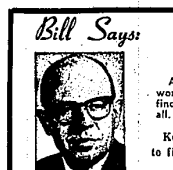

Sewer Problem Solution Near

City Manager John Dineen informed members of the City Council at their regular meeting Monday night, May 3, that the state health department had approved the city's plan for installing a new 15 inch sewer line south of Valleyview to correct sanitary sewer back-up problems.

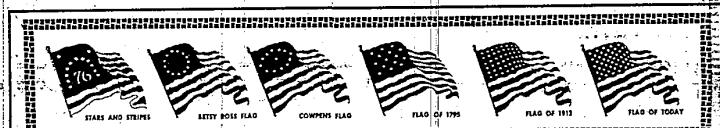
The problem and methods of correcting it have been the subject of long and often very heated debates at numerous City Council meetings over the past several months.

Carl Shaw who has been most directly affected by the problem had disagreed with the city earlier on the plan for the new 15 inch line stating it would not be adequate. It is still not certain whether he is thoroughly convinced even though both the city engineer and state health department officials are.

Councilmen approved an expenditure of approximately \$3,000 to make the 15 inch line installation. Approval of this expenditure, however, was made contingent upon the city attorney being able to work out satisfactory construction rights with Shaw and to get him to drop an injunction he has against the city regarding another sewer line running through his property. Actually, the line which the injunction relates to runs under Shaw's house.

Work can be started in 15 to 20 days if Shaw agreed to drop his injunction and grant construction rights.
