Vic's father, Mr. Palmer died in his home in Lafayette, Indiana last Friday. He had celebrated his 84th birthday

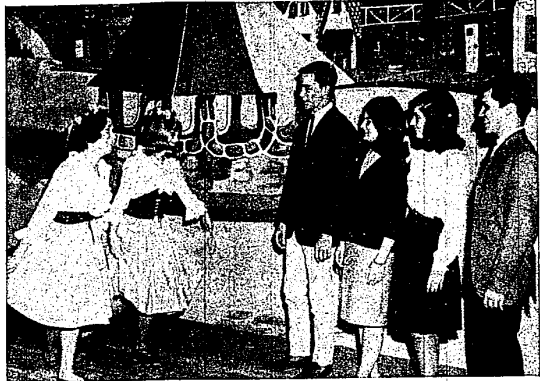
