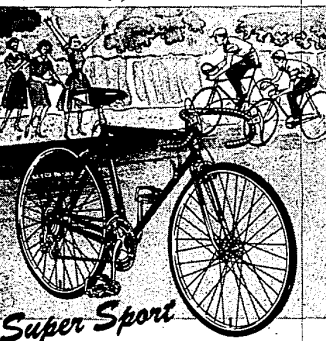

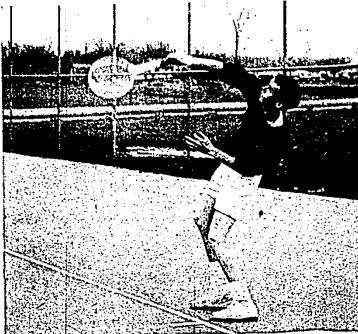

"Covered Bridges" Is Topic For Quakertown Questers

Quakertown Questers heard a study report given by Mrs. Robert Mock on "Covered Bridges" at the Questers' May 26 meeting held at the home of Mrs. George Newman, 23240 Power Road, Farmington.

It was learned from this enlightening talk that covered bridges were first built during the eighteenth century and a few as late as the early nineteenth century. In 1857 a bridge carpenter was paid as little as sixty to sixty-five cents a day.

These LOCAL BRIDGES soon took on the flavor of the towns they served and retained names that were descriptive; or the bridge was named after the nearest farm it served. One Ohio bridge was named by children who were chased by the irritable toll collector; it became "Old Meaney's Bridge." Old Maid Park bridge in Vermont got its name from the old maiden lady who owned land on one side of the bridge.

Mrs. Mock further went on to say that covered bridges represent the artistry of our forefathers and their skill as engineers, and to millions of Americans they have become symbols of a fast disappearing past. Their charm lies in the fact that they are roofed, which brings us to the charming explanation for this. Builders in Maryland and Virginia put it this way, "Our bridges were covered, my dear Sir, for the same reason that our belles wore hoop skirts and

crinolines — to protect the structural beauty that is seldom seen, but nevertheless appreciated."

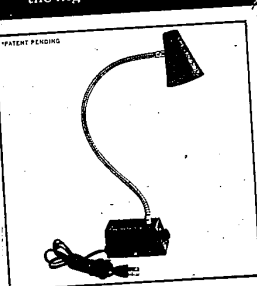

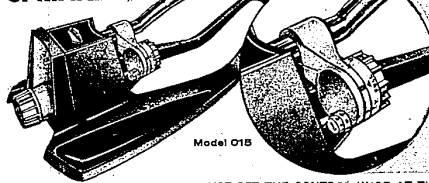

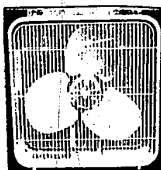
