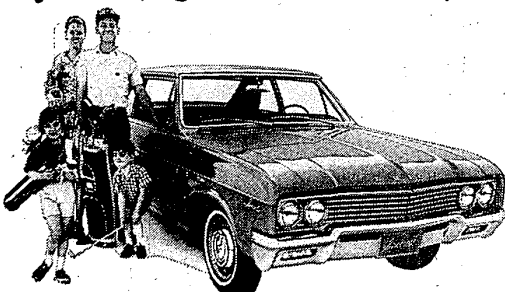

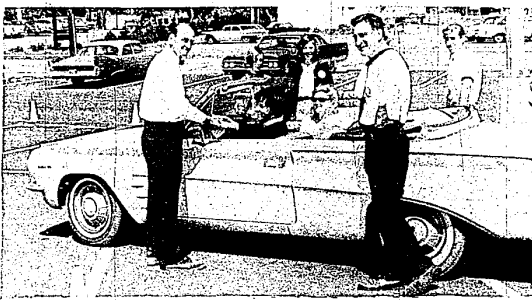

Dr. Tirrell is an Air Force veteran of World War II. He was graduated from Hope College in 1949 and received his Master's Degree from the University of Michigan in 1951. He attended Massachusetts Institute of Technology and received his Doctor's Degree in education at Harvard University in 1954.

The North Farmington High School Commencement speaker has been a teacher and principal in Michigan public schools, assistant director of the Harvard Center for Field Studies, and was dean of the Grand Rapids Junior College from 1955 to 1958. He also served as general secretary of the Michigan Association of Alumni Association from 1953 to 1962. Prior to his assuming the presidency of Oakland Community College, he was Vice-President for Instruction at St. Louis Community College.

Dr. Tirrell is a former president of the Michigan Association of Junior Colleges, and has served on the Governor's Commission on Community Junior Colleges. In 1956 he was designated as one of the five outstanding young men in Michigan. He has written extensively on problems and challenges of higher education, particularly in the field of junior colleges.

119 at C'ville To be Awarded Diplomas

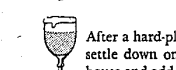

ties with ample private off-street parking still provided. **THE ARGUMENT** presented by Hall was that while old building owners had provided no suitable off-street parking space in the past the city was still buying up land from them and giving them credit against their special assessment cost for the off-street parking improvement while he was getting no such credit and having to pay the greatest amount for the proposed improvement of anyone in the block.

Hall emphasized the fact that he has been paying all most \$500 yearly in taxes on the land area he owns being used for parking as well as money for maintaining it for parking use.

City Manager John Dian took issue with Hall on each of the points he made. The city manager stated that nearly all of the parking area adjacent to the auto dealership building was being used to park new and used cars on. Pictorial were presented showing employees' cars parked in the alley behind the building and elsewhere other than in the parking lot.

THE CITY MANAGER also contended that should Hall's building be converted to offices the parking area he now has would not be sufficient under terms of the city zoning ordinance.

Dian emphasized that the assessment against Hall's property had only been levied on the 50 feet of actual building frontage he has and that no assessment was computed on the vacant parking area that also fronts out onto Grand River.

Hall was at least successful in getting a delay. When it came time to pass a formal resolution authorizing a go ahead with the off-street parking improvement, the council's decision was to withhold action until a complete review of the method of assessment can be discussed by them with the city manager and city attorney.

Hall was the only objector at the cost estimate hearing.

HEARINGS were then held on the cost estimates for the providing of an off-street parking lot south of Grand River west of Farmington Road and

the paving of Thomas Street from Farmington Road to Warner Street with no objections being voiced.

The parking lot in the southwest downtown quadrant will cost \$13,922.16 with the cost to each benefiting property owner running \$31.50 per front foot. The cost for the paving of Thomas Street will run \$42,820 or \$4.50 per running foot to benefiting property owners.

Formal resolutions authorizing a go ahead on both of these latter projects were adopted at the conclusion of the Council meeting.

Supervisor Curt Hall made a direct statement on the compromise decision of the allocation board but indicated that he had no personal desire to appeal on this decision. Hall, other members of the Township Board will feel on this matter is still to be learned, however.
