Delay Action On Sub Plan

Plans for Colony Park Subdivision in the 13 Mile-Farmington Road area came up for final approval before the Township Board at its regular meeting Monday night, June 14, but action was tabled.

Being a planned unit type of development, with land area set aside for a park or open space, the requirements are that a layout of how the open space is proposed to be landscaped and developed and that escrow money must be advanced to assure that the work will be done before final plan approval is given.

Neither the landscape architect's plans for the open space area or an escrow check was submitted with the plans for the subdivision and a representative of the development company planning the subdivision was not present at the meeting.
