The Junior Engineers and Scientists Summer Institute (JESSI) will be under the direction of DePauw's Dr. Hugh Henry and is to be staffed by DePauw faculty members.

ORIENTED TOWARD career planning, JESSI is tailored to give students a glimpse of what a half dozen academic disciplines are all about. In addition, this daily lecture will emphasize the academic preparations students should be making in high school and college to be best equipped for the careers they seek.

The curriculum planned for the JESSI enrollees includes zoology, physics, chemistry, geology, astronomy and mathematics. Campus dormitories are to serve as the students' campus homes. The JESSI program, in its seventh year at the private Hoosier university, is sponsored by Scientists of Tomorrow, a non-profit organization based in Portland, Oregon, in conjunction with DePauw University.
