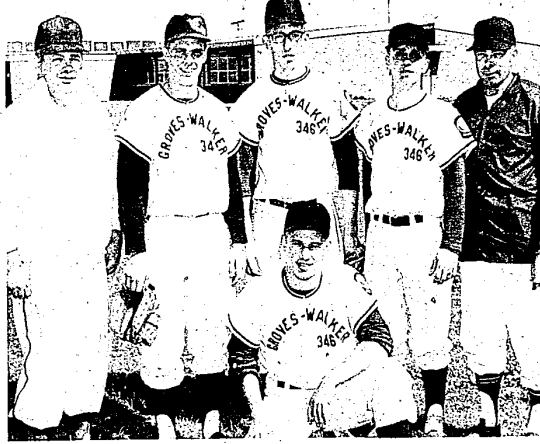

Grouping of Signs Proposed

Rather than a lot of individual church signs on main thoroughfares leading into the City of Farmington, City Manager John Dinan suggested at the regular Council meeting Monday night that a sign grouping for all churches interested would be much more attractive.

The city manager was instructed by councilmen to contact the various churches in an effort to determine whether they would be interested in working together on such a project.

Study on a solution to the sign problem was prompted by a recent request from the Salem Church for permission to put up new signs at three or four different locations at the city's boundaries.

Meadowbrook Bonds Approved

The Municipal Finance Commission, announced this week that it had approved \$155,000 of "Meadowbrook Hills Water Main Special Assessment Bonds" for the Township of Farmington, Oakland County.

Attorney General Kelley said, "The proceeds will be used to construct water mains in Special Assessment District No. 25 in the Township of Farmington; specifically, in Tralee Trail, Centerfarm Lane, Rhonwood Drive, Rhonwood Court, Lajon Drive, Westfarm Lane, Southfarm Lane, Silken Glen and Eight Mile Road.

"These bonds are payable primarily from a like amount of the future due and unpaid installments of special assessments in 15 annual installments, with the full faith and credit of the township pledged to meet principal and interest should the installments be slow in coming in."
