Cornerstone Laid For New Monastery

The Corner Stone was laid last Sunday, June 27, for the new Monastery of the Blessed Sacrament for the Cloistered Dominican Nuns at Thirteen Mile and Middlebelt roads.

The Right Reverend Mgr. Thomas P. Behan performed the ceremony. Speakers for the occasion were the Very Reverend Mgr. Arthur M. Karcy of St. Joseph's Parish, Lahser Road, and Mr. Alfred J. Fisher, Jr., President of Fisher Industries, Mr. Frank A. Alter served as Master of Ceremonies.

"This is indeed a milestone in the progress of the construction of the new Monastery," said a spokesman, "and it marks the official opening of a campaign to raise the minimum need of \$500,000 to complete construction."

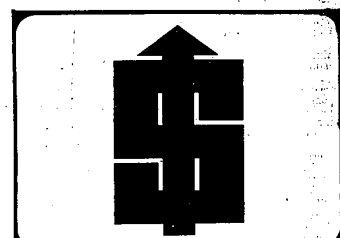
