Mrs. Ruth Morovitz, an east-side housewife, first became interested in her own celebrated missionary project through a pencil letter written eight years ago by her son to a Japanese boy in Fukushima, 100 miles north of Tokyo. Today in Fukushima there stands the Izumi (Fountain of the Living Water) Lutheran Church - its buildings, furnishings, organ and even its congregation - the result of Mrs. Morovitz's activities.

Officers of the Missions Guild of the League, sponsors of the forthcoming meeting, welcome all to hear the heart-warming inspiring story of the intervening years.

The Women's League is a recently formed organization of the Lutheran Church of the Shepherd King made up of eight Guilds. The membership participated actively in pursuits denoted by the Guild name such as, Missions, Music, Christian Literature, Hospitality, Alter, Garden, Nursery, and Office. The program of the League is one of service, worship, study and fellowship. First Presbyterian Church To Give Parent-Child Education Program

The First Presbyterian Church of Farmington at Farmington Road and Eleven Mile will sponsor a Parent-Child Education program.

The program will be held on three Wednesday evenings, October 23, November 6 and November 13, from 8 to 10 o'clock. A fee of \$1.00 will be charged. Registrations may be made with Mrs. Robert Potter, GR. 4-2223.

The Parent-Child Education Program was developed by the Family Life Department of the Detroit Council of Churches as a means of aiding parents to fulfill one of their primary responsibilities, church officials said. It is a part of Christian heritage to teach our children God's creative purpose in fashioning man, both male and female.

"It is a well known fact that all children will learn about sex, but this education without proper guidance may not be wholesome, adequate or true," Dr. Donald Schroeder of the Detroit Council of Churches stated. "It is also known that the occurrence of parenthood per se does not equip parents with either the facts, suitable vocabulary or attitude to interpret reproduction of sex. It is becoming more evident that a sound sex education is relevant to an adequate and mature Christian philosophy of life. Wholesome outlook, proper perspectives and attitudes are of primary importance, but these are never gained in the absence or distortion of facts. Many parents not only need but desire help in knowing more fully the facts of reproduction and sex in their relevance to the normal growth and development of children, a suitable vocabulary, and a tried method of instruction. Sometimes they even more need help in meeting their own emotional problems in the realm of sex before they can give wholesome instruction to their own children."

The pattern of the parent-child education program is for a minimum of three two hour sessions, with husbands and wives attending as couples. It is expected that in registering that the couple will plan to attend all three sessions. The three teaching units presented are:

1. The place of sex in a Christian philosophy of life.
2. The basic facts of reproduction.
3. The understanding of the growth of the child and the interpretation of facts and meaning.
