

## Seek Office Girls For Work Abroad

Two years overseas with pay may sound too good to be true, but it is an opportunity now being offered to young men of area secretaries, stenographers, typists and clerks who are willing to travel anywhere in the world.

Miss Kathryn Groot, Personnel Officer from the United States Department of State, is now at 7310 Woodward Avenue, in Detroit, to interview applicants who are between the ages of 21 and 35, single with no dependents and U. S. citizens in excellent health, for assignment to any one of the 270 American Embassies, Consulates and Legations abroad.

All salaries are supplemented by overseas allowances and free housing. Employees are offered liberal vacations while overseas and, between each tour of duty, are given six weeks of home leave at Government expense.

## Make Sure Child Gets Needed Sleep

School assignments will seem easier and your child will benefit more fully from his school opportunities if he is fully rested when he leaves home in the morning.

Dr. Joseph G. M. Moore, physician of health, suggests to parents. To make sure that he is rested and ready for new responsibilities and ideas requires careful planning and constant supervision by the parents in order to see it through.

Naps taken by children in the daytime drop sharply when children reach five and they enter kindergarten. See that your child is not deprived of the sleep he needs at night because the large group he mingles with in the classroom are new to him and because many of his school experiences are new.

He is likely to be keyed up. This makes it necessary to have definite plans for more rest at home. The kindergarten child should be in bed by 8:00 p.m. if he is to be up at 7:00 a.m. If your child is nervous or tired by the middle of the morning, chances are that home conditions and home planning should be improved.

Children in elementary school need nine to 11 hours of sleep, depending on their age, general health and physical make-up. In general, ten hours sleep, at least eight to nine hours sleep. A little experimentation will determine if being up an extra 15 minutes at night means "dodgy" irresponsibility in the morning.

## Mushroom Tales Prompts Cancer Research at MSU

Folklore about a Bavarian mushroom underlies a Michigan State University cancer research project being supported by the National Institute of Health.

University scientists are attempting to isolate from the mushroom a material which has been found to inhibit tumor growth in rats and mice.

The study goes back to the local folklore of a Bavarian Bohemian forest valley, according to Dr. Eugene H. Lucas, professor of horticulture who is working with chemist Dr. Richard U. Byerrum.

He said the folklore described how people who ate certain mushrooms, which grow abundantly in that area, never developed cancer.

A concentration of the tumor inhibiting material has been obtained and now must be purified and identified. To get it the mushroom was ground up with water and an extract made. When injected into mice and rats, the extract slowed down the growth of tumors.

The new grant from the National Institutes of Health will be used to concentrate the study on the chemical makeup of the inhibiting material.

## Fewer Governors Get Leg. Start

State legislative experience is not as important for prospective governors now as it used to be, according to findings of a political scientist at Michigan State University.

Dr. Joseph A. Schlesinger, who surveyed political careers of all state governors from 1870 to 1930, found that the proportion of governors who had previously served in the legislature, dropped from 65 per cent in 1870 to about 41 per cent in recent years.

Legislative experience appears to be even less of a factor in the West, he added. Some 30 per cent of Oregon governors had held no previous elected office.

In a number of states in the South the tendency seems to be to select the governor from law enforcement positions such as judge and state attorney, while in New England the lieutenant governor is often promoted to governor, Dr. Schlesinger explained.

The legal profession has furnished the most governors in the past 80 years—56 out of 995 elected governors in all states; he said—brought out in Utah and Delaware during the study period.

Dr. Schlesinger's findings are being published by M.S.U.'s Bureau of Governmental Research, titled "How They Became Governors."

The bureau is said to have been organized in Bayonne, France, in the 17th century.

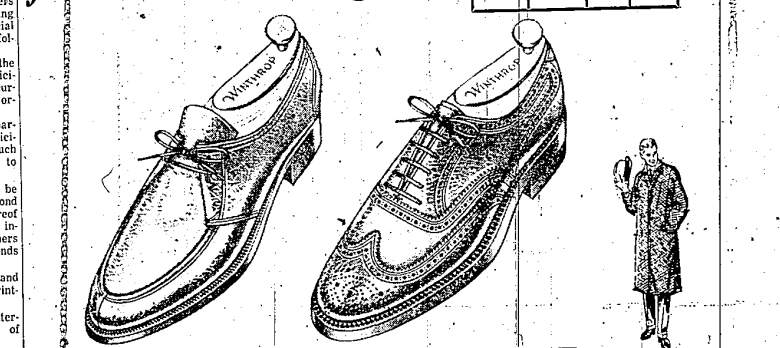

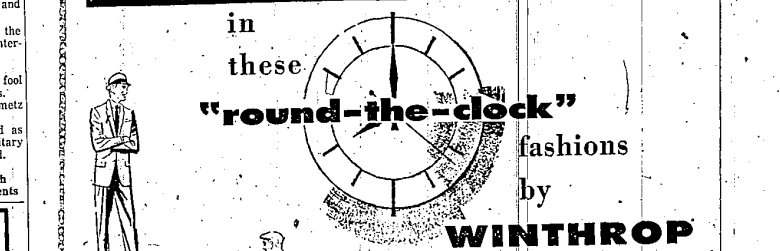
