Southfield Community Pastor Giving Bible Series

Pastor Raymond Bayne of the Southfield Community Church, 12221 Indian (near Eight Mile and Inkster), is conducting a series of Bible studies at all regular services of the church with emphasis on a victorious life experience.

At the morning worship service at 11:15 a.m. he is preaching verse by verse through the "Book of Philippians" written by Paul to the church with the keynote of "rejoice". More than one hundred young sing each Sunday morning in a combined youth choir.

The "Book of Acts," basic history of the motives, method, and might of the early Church is being studied verse by verse at the evening service at 7 p.m. An informal sing service with special music by members of the church highlights this service which closes about 8:30.

The Wednesday night Prayer Fellowship at 7:45 includes chapter Bible study of the interesting and unique "Book of Ezekiel" with its many unusual visions and symbols.

In addition, there are three adult bible classes at 10:00 Sunday morning including a study of Bible Divisions for young adults with Mr. Francis Wallace, teacher; a verse study of Romans, basic book of Christian doctrine, in the pastor's home; and a study of the Gospel of John by Mr. Stephen Ellsworth for adults past 50.

"Heart of Home" Class Opens Dec. 3

Women with heart disease, high blood pressure, hardening of the arteries, rheumatic heart disease and other circulatory ailments can now register for free "Heart of the Home" classes to be held in December starting Tuesday, December 3.

The work-implication classes are conducted by the Michigan Heart Association in cooperation with Michigan State University and the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service and are designed to show the homemaker how to conserve her time and energy while doing her various household tasks.

Lectures, demonstrations and slides are presented to show homemakers how they can simplify work in the preparation of meals, washing and ironing, bed making, and other daily housework.

Each homemaker attends four, 2-hour long, lecture-demonstration classes which will be held on December 3, 5, 10 and 12 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. and will meet at the Oakland County Health Center, Central Office, at 1070 North Telegraph Road.

Mrs. Kefauver of the Michigan State University Department of Home Economics conducts the classes. She indicates that the classes are designed to bring the economic level and that it is not necessary to remodel a home in order to conserve the homemaker's time and energy.

The course is available to every woman in Oakland County, although those with a heart or blood vessel ailment will be given first listing. Homemakers may register for the free classes by calling or writing Mrs. Mary Hixon, Home Demonstration Agent, 1290 W. Boulevard, Pontiac, Michigan, telephone Pontiac, FEderal 4-5564. Homemakers are urged to register this week in order that they may attend the first class on Tuesday, December 3.

No medical advice, diagnosis, treatment, or examination is given in the "Heart of the Home" classes.

The Oakland County Medical Society has endorsed the entire program and Doctors of Medicine will be urged to refer their patients to the classes.

The "Heart of the Home" Program is made possible by the Michigan Heart Association through funds received from the Pontiac Area United Fund.

The main auditorium seats 1500. A youth chapel in the basement seats 400 and separate auditoriums are provided for the junior, primary, kindergarten, and cradle roll divisions.
