Gifted Students Get Help

The special cademic probems of gitted children in Michigan will be eased with the help of an appropriation included in the recently-passed state school aid bill by the Senate Appropriations Committee member Carl D. Fursell (F-Pyrmouth).

The bill will allow school districts to receive up to \$150,000 in state funks for evaluating existing programs or experimenting with new ones for the instruction of gifted children.
