

Record Numbers Use State Parks

Michigan state park officials are looking for a place to pitch a tent. In fact, they are looking for hundreds of camp sites to accommodate the growing army of resident and tourist campers. A record number of campers used state park facilities during 1957, amassing a total of more than 1,750,000 camper-days of use. This total compares with 1,450,000 camper-days of use in 1956 and 1,200,000 in 1955. In addition, an estimated 35,000 persons had to be turned away at state parks where camping areas and sanitary facilities were at capacity use. The overflow would have been even greater, but some campers were permitted to pitch tents or right beside when regular camp sites were filled. Through late November, more than 116,000 camping permits were issued in state parks with an average of four persons per camp. Most parks are forced to limit the number of campers because sanitary facilities are limited.
