Meth. Missionary To Speak Sunday

A Methodist missionary, who has been a teacher, pastor and evangelistic specialist in Malaya for 20 years, will be the guest speaker at the First Methodist Church of Farmington during both Sunday morning worship services, at 9:15 and 10:40 a.m.

The Rev. Waldo S. Reinhold, whose American home is Alhambra, California, has returned to the United States for a year's furlough from his work on the mission field.

Assigned to Malaya in 1932, Mr. Reinhold was for five years a teacher in Methodist schools in Penang and Singapore and an evangelist. For a year he was pastor of the Wesley Methodist Church in Singapore and from 1939 to 1941 he was pastor of Wesley Church in Seremban and principal of the Methodist school in that town.

For two years during World War II, Mr. Reinhold was pastor of the Asbury Methodist Church in Los Angeles. In 1947 he returned to Malaya as pastor of the Wesley Church in Singapore.

For the last five years, Mr. Reinhold has been pastor of the Wesley Methodist Church in Malacca and doing general evangelistic work. He was also chairman of the Board of Evangelism of the Malaysia Chinese Conference, which serves the Chinese-speaking Methodists of the country. A native of Cornwall, India, Mr. Reinhold is a graduate of the University of Southern California (bachelor of arts), the University of Chicago (master of divinity), and the University of Chicago (master of arts). For three years before becoming a missionary, he was pastor of the Methodist Church of Paso Robles, California.
