## Work on Area MSU Branch To Start Soon

Full co-operation of the people of Oakland and Macomb Counties will be necessary for the success of the new branch university to be established by Michigan State University at Meadow Brook Farms on the outskirts of Rochester, United States. President Dr. John A. Hannah told a capacity crowd who gathered to hear him talk at Rochester High last week. Bids on the first new building to be erected there will be opened in March. Money for this building and others has been made possible through a \$2,000,000 grant made by Mr. and Mrs. Alfred C. Wilson at the same time that they gave the 1,400-acre estate to the university the early part of last year. In his talk, Hannah pointed out that there were only 40,000 college age persons living within a 15 mile radius of the site alone and that it is estimated there will be 54,000 by 1960 and 103,000 in this age group living within the same area by 1970. It will be up to the residents of Oakland and Macomb counties to determine what course the new branch university will take, Hannah commented.
