# New Cinerama Movie to Open In Detroit Feb. 11

The midwest premiere of the newest Cinerama production, "Search for Paradise," has been announced for February 11, at the Music Hall Theatre, Detroit.

The current Lowell Thomas presentation, "Seven Wonders of the World," will have its last showing February 9. By that date the film will have played 78 weeks, establishing another record for Michigan screen entertainment.

"Search for Paradise" is the story of two American aviators looking for an escape from the complicated modern world. Their search takes them through the "roof of the world" in Central Asia.

As part of the picture, Thomas recorded the coronation of King Mahendra of Nepal where he was President Eisenhower's personal representative.

The shooting of the rapids of the Indus River in a rubber raft and a sequence on jet aviation of the United States Air Force are among the thrilling portions of the Cinerama's three lensed cameras, which gives the audience the feeling of being "in the picture".
