She told how 46 years ago Juliette Low, though in poor health and almost totally deaf, traveled throughout the United States sharing her idea of scouting for girls. Today there are 15,712 registered Girl Scouts and adults in Southern Oakland County, a tribute to her devoted efforts of almost 30 years ago.

The program honoring the birthday of Juliette Low consisted of a number of skits and songs. The whole group sang "There's No Scouting like Girl Scouting" and "Happy Birthday" to all Girl Scouts.

Skits put on by the various troops were: Troop 223, a folk song; Troop 237, health and safety; Troop 344, the hop (a modern dance); Troop 352, nature study; Troop 170, homemaking; Troop 458, the Brownie story; Troop 228, a skit on games; Troop 956, a Virginia Reel and Troop 175, a pantomime acted on a record of the Lawrence Walker, committee member of Troop 352, adorned the table for this ceremony.
