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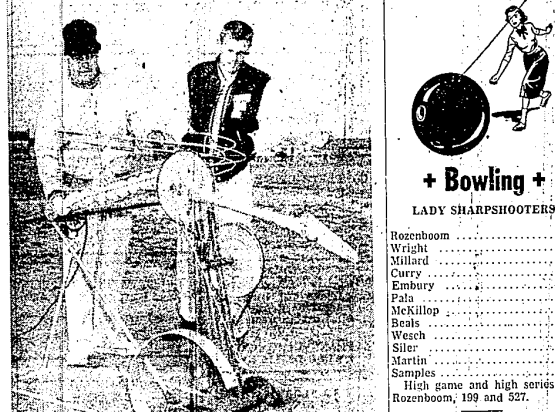

The first track meet of the '58 season, the Huron Relays, was held last Friday, March 29, at Vpsilanti from 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Rex Cavley, the Farmingtonite to look out for in this year's season, earned two medals by placing first in the low hurdles and second in the high hurdles in the finals.

Cavley also cleared 5'8" in the high jump. The Farmington record for the high jump is 5'9".

Jim Marsh ran in the mile in the meet.

In the sprint medley relay, Mike Agee, Dave Catherman, Roy Jordan and Bob Rumsford, finished third in the finals in their heat.

Dwight Nicks jumped 12' 7" in the broad jump, but did not qualify for the finals.

Tom Grimshaw ran in the 60 yard dash but also did not qualify.

Five other schools participated in a heat of the 880 yard sprint relay with Mike Agee, Dave Catherman, Rex Cavley and Tom Grimshaw representing Farmington. They won their heat, but the time was not good enough to qualify for the finals.

In the two mile relay, Ed Fulton, Dan Machon, Tom Murphy and Nick Stout ran, but they did not qualify.

Tom Peckham, Dewey Nichols, Roy Jordan and Tom Grimshaw placed third in their heat of the shuttle hurdle relay, but that also was not good enough to qualify.

Mr. Gene Freed, track team coach, stated, "Even though our team had only two weeks of practice, there were good individual performances."

The team is looking forward to the next meet on April 17, at Van Dyke, at 4:00 p.m.
