Correct Figures On Hospital Cost - A recent editorial, as part of its content, said that information we had received in regard to the cost of care for operation of Farmington Children's Hospital. Our informant, a state employee in a position to know, evidently was wrong. There are those who are happy to publish this letter from a man who undoubtedly does know where he speaks. Editor Dear Editor - Your editorial of March 7, 1958 called to my attention, particularly the paragraph which contains a statement to the effect that the State's operation of Farmington Children's Hospital is excessively expensive, namely, \$39.00 per day per patient. From July 1 to February 28, 1958 the cost of housing, clothing, feeding, and other expenses of the State's patients in this hospital is \$8.21 per day per patient. Our per capita cost figure is obtained by dividing the total cost of operating costs by the number of patient days. The only item of expenditure that we do not include is equipment, which was regarded as a capital outlay item. In the Farmington Children's Hospital figure of \$8.21 per patient per day is included rental figure of \$600.00. Do we regard this figure as excessive? Frankly, yes we do. The State's cost per patient at the Laper State Home and Training School as of the end of February 1958 was \$4.69, in contrast to our \$8.21 to \$10.00 figure used in your editorial. But, as you undoubtedly know, our operations at Farmington Children's Hospital were brought about by emergency circumstances and occasioned by a long waiting list caused by lack of sufficient state owned facilities to care for our mentally deficient children. The Farmington operation is expensive in part because of the large number of crib cases and in part because it is not the size (1,500 or better) of our other facilities for mentally deficient children. What is the answer? I think, obviously, we must push forward with the governor's program to speed the construction of the Plymouth State Home and Training School and beginning planning for a similar institution in Western Michigan. I am sure you are anxious to learn that it is costing us currently 45 cents per day to feed the mental patients at the Ypsilanti (population 4,100) and the Kalamazoo State Hospitals (population 3,500). In Agnews, California, an institution of similar size and character, operated by the State of California, is costing us more than \$1.00 per day per patient. The total daily cost per patient at Ypsilanti is \$3.96 and at Kalamazoo \$4.00. These are figures, by the way, which stand in sharp contrast with the \$5.21 per day which the state of California is paying in an institution of similar size and character in that state. In closing, I should like to state that in view of your obvious interest in this subject I would be more than happy to furnish you a member of your staff check our figures at any time that you are in Lansing.
