Students attending Madonna, Schooleraft Community, and Oakland Community Colleges under the state
scholarship program may
benefit from a bill recently
signed into law by Gov. Milliken.

Maximum scholarships will be increased from \$800 to \$1,200.

Scholarships are available to Michigan students attending the state's independent and public colleges and universities. Monetary awards are based on the results of an annual competitive scholarship examination and assessment of the applicant's financial need. financial need.

Instituted by the Legisla-ture in 1985, the state sup-ported scholarship program has assisted thousands of stu-il dents. During the past ac-demic year, approximately 13,000 public and 3,000 inde-bendent college students par-ticipated in the program.
